

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 12 OF THE DISTRICT CODE AND
ADOPT MANDATORY SOLID WASTE, ORGANIC WASTE, AND RECYCLING
MATERIALS RULES AND REGULATIONS AND MAKING A DETERMINATION OF
EXEMPTION UNDER CEQA

WHO: Public hearing will be held by the Oceano Community Services District (OCS D) Board of Directors.

WHEN: The hearing will be held on **December 8, 2021, at 6:00 p.m.** To determine the placement of the item on the agenda go to the OCS D website at oceanocsd.org on the Friday before the scheduled hearing date.

WHERE: The Board of Directors will hold the hearing by teleconference via Zoom pursuant to the OCS D Resolution 2021-12.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE: The Board shall consider the adoption of a proposed ordinance to establish programs in support of solid waste legislation (AB 341, AB 1826 and SB 1383), by amending title 12 of the District Code. The proposed ordinance would codify and/or establish (1) the requirement that residents and business segregate organic materials for collection, (2) a waiver program for residents and businesses segregate organic materials for collection, (3) requirements for Edible Food Generators to donate edible food to food recovery organizations, (4) reporting requirements for Food Recovery Organizations, (5) Garbage Hauler and Facility Operator Requirements for collecting organic materials, and (6) provisions to enforce these requirements.

WHAT'S AVAILABLE: You can review a copy of the proposed ordinance on the District's website or request a copy at the Office of the Board at 1655 Front St Oceano, CA 93445 between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on weekdays. The proposed ordinance was introduced to the public at the November 10th meeting of the OCS D Board as item 8A (available at <https://oceanocsd.org/wp-content/uploads/bsk-pdf-manager/2021/11/11102021-Combined-Agenda.pdf>.)

ENVIRONMENTAL INFORMATION: Also to be considered is the determination that this project is exempt from environmental review under CEQA based on the determination that the Ordinance will not have a significant effect on the environment and will protect the environment, CEQA Guidelines § 15061(b)(3) and 15308.

WHERE YOU COME IN: At the hearing any interested person may express their views for or against, or to change the ordinance. Also, if you challenge this matter in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing or in written correspondence delivered to the appropriate authority at or before the public hearing.
